Baranik:

"A few years ago the students could count on well paid job in their profession. Now it looks different. The students are thinking about some new polish saying: go and study, you'll become educated unemployed. It is no wonder that it is very important for the students to join the European structures."

The shortage of the job-offers has caused 1,5 thousend registred unemployed people in our region, who had graduated from the high schools. It is twice as much as two years ago. That's because many of students who speak foreign languages very well are thinking about jobs in the European Union-countries.

Banaszkiewicz:

"Is it possible after we join the European Union my diploma will be respected in the EU-countries?"

The answer is – yes. But you have to draw your attention to education program in those countries. For example the students in France could have some differences in their program and it could not tie in with the program in Poland.

Żurek:

"For comparison the education system in the European countries we use a special program NARIK."

After we join the European Union we will have to abide by at least two directives in the education system.

Żurek:

"According to the first of them (from 1989) we have to respect all high school-diplomas where the education lasts a minimum of three years. The second one (from 1993) regards mainly the education in the vocational training schools."

The polish diplomas are respected now in Germany and in Austria. After the closure of the border it should change. Then the polish-educated people will have a chance to find a job in the foreign companies. Today most offers consists of work in restaurants, pubs and construction.
