EBU international training

Programme 2003

The **EBU International Training** unit organizes training courses for TV and radio working professionals in five areas: production, journalism, technology, business affairs and new media, which are delivered in four different formats: seminars, workshops, long-term training and cross-disciplinary projects. Each format is adapted to the programme content and targeted audience.

Most of these training programmes are offered exclusively to EBU active and associate Members. However, certain training programmes are available to non-EBU Members.



Seminars & mastercourses



Seminars and mastercourses deal with cross-border themes and are designed for a multinational audience. They are either organized in cooperation with a host organization or held in Geneva at the EBU headquarters.

Seminars have developed their own brand by dealing with topics from a public service broadcaster's viewpoint and creating the foundations for a network of professionals. This unique environment makes it possible to share experiences and compare various cultural models.

Mastercourses are designed for a limited number of participants (10-20). The speakers can build up close and interactive relations between the participants. On these courses 75% of the time is devoted to practical exercises and 25% to presentations. The practical exercises are varied: role games, teamwork, review of programmes and plenary discussions.

Workshops



Workshops are designed for a single country and deal with one specific subject. The content is tailored to the requirements of one organization and to the specific needs of participants. Workshops provide flexible training solutions. Their added value rest on the greatest possible involvement of a group of professionals from an organization supporting motivated participants. The learning methods are based on "doing, showing and telling" so that each participant gradually works out his/her own personal learning method.

Cross-disciplinary project



This innovative training format allows participants from different professional backgrounds to experience together the very topic of the training. This project includes a series of thematic visits and practical discussions. Various EBU Members can compare and exchange practices.

The first project deals with the digitisation of the news-room. News managers, journalists and personnel in charge of digitisation (broadcast and IT engineers), as well as human

resources and training managers are welcome to initiate a dialogue. For the second year, the EBU aims to create a forum where the experience of EBU Members can be compared and discussed.

In the second project, the discussion on enhancing quality in TV and radio programming should gather programme managers, creative people, commissioning editors, editorial policy makers, and training managers. The ultimate goal is to reinforce the viewer's continuing loyalty to public service broadcasters.

Long term training



The three long-term training courses combine 2 to 3 class-room training with on-line tutoring and coaching:

- The eight-month **new media technologies** course confirms its quality thanks to a close and mature partnership with the trainers (New Media Technology College – NMTC, Ireland) and the EBU Members.
 - Participants in this course will learn significant multimedia production skills and will extend their ability through practical projects using industry-standard new media production technologies.
- The EBU Master School on Radio documentaries aims at coaching 12 producers over a ten-month period from the initial idea to the final production and broadcast of a personal radio documentary.
- The new project dedicated to the EBU Members from the three Maghreb countries will deal with digital images & sound in production and broadcast.

The EBU has entered into a new partnership with GRETA Pays Basque, France, in collaboration with the major French broadcasters to set up this three-year project.

In 2003, selected technical staff from Algerian radio and Algerian TV will benefit from a eight-month course, a combination of on-site training, distance learning and tutoring.

Long-term training On-line course on Web technologies

April 2003 - November 2003

- for TVR staff only, in Bucharest, Romania
- for ERTU staff only, in Cairo, Egypt
- who should attend: 15-20 participants from each broadcaster from various fields of expertise (engineers, IT people, producers, journalists). The participants will be selected by the host broadcasters and NMTC - New Media Technology College - Dublin, Ireland.
- This EBU on-line course is organized in partnership with NMTC. NMTC will deliver the on-line training (tutorials, course Web site with a moderator, task completion chart), hold 2 intensive class-rooms on each site and will finally coordinate on-line development projects for participants.
- The course will train broadcast professionals in Web authoring (html, Dreamweaver), in digital imaging (Photoshop, Illustrator), in digital animation (Flash) and in on-line broadcasting (Adobe Premiere, Real Technologies and sound).
- The on-line course will require approximately two to three-hour study daily over a period of 8 months. All facilities will be provided by the host broadcasters including workstations, new media production tools, and cameras.
- Participants will be awarded a Certificate on satisfactory completion of the course and the related assignments.
- As well as the acquisition of essential knowledge, this long-term training aims to create a group of skilled and highly-dedicated people to become the drivers for change in their organization.


